1. Bailey Bridge Panels:


Sprung Bailey bridge panels from destroyed and washed out bridges can be salvaged and used in many ways. Used in the construction of bunkers in conjunction with roofing tin and sandbags, they make an excellent protection from small arms fire and mortar rounds.

2. Native Stone Headwalls:

Since sandbags are no longer authorized for culvert headwalls we have turned to native stone headwalls. With plenty of natural rock and sand and cement used as mortar a strong and decorative headwall can be made.

3. Barbed Wire Stringing:

When large quantities of barbed wire need to be strung the use of a 1/4 ton jeep is most helpful. After removing the back seat, the barbed wire can be suspended by a steel bar through the center of the roll. The bar should be secured on the wheel hubs so it will not move. Then using low gear the barbed wire can be strung rapidly and with relatively low man power.
